Directors shall serve without remuneration, and no director shall directly or indirectly receive any profit from his or her position as such, provided that a director may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties. A director shall not be prohibited from receiving compensation for services provided to the Corporation in another capacity.

**Schedule 1
to Articles of Continuance of
Spinal Cord Injury Canada**

- a) to bind together in a spirit of fraternity all men and women with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- b) to obtain mutual aid and protection and to make provision for all individuals with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- c) to foster and assist the vocational and professional training of all individuals with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- d) to promote the education, profitable employment and social well-being as far as possible of all individuals with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- e) to investigate and promote the study of spinal cord injury and other mobility disabilities and to establish or assist in the establishment of a research laboratory or laboratories with the necessary appliances for the purpose of ensuring that the best possible treatment and equipment is provided for all individuals with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- f) to make representations to appropriate departments of Government concerning adjustment of pensions and any other claims to which any individual with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities may be entitled;
- g) to establish, maintain and operate employment and information bureaus, libraries and establishments for the benefit, treatment and advancement generally of all individuals with a spinal cord injury or other mobility disabilities;
- h) to establish, organize and regulate provincial and local branches or chapters in convenient centres throughout Canada, or to affiliate or co-operate with other bodies or associations with similar aims and objects throughout Canada;
- i) to raise funds for all purposes of the Corporation by fees from its members, by private or public subscriptions, by subsidies from the Federal and Provincial Governments and urban and rural authorities, and any other ways and means which the Corporation may determine;
- j) to purchase, take, have, hold, possess, retain and enjoy any property, real or personal, corporeal or incorporeal, whatsoever, and for any or every estate or interest therein whatsoever given, granted, devised or bequeathed to it, or appropriated, purchased or acquired by it in any manner or way whatsoever to, for, or in favour of the uses and purposes of the Corporation;
- k) to carry on with its aims and objects solely as a non-political, non-partisan and non-sectarian Corporation.

Schedule 2
to Articles of Continuance of
Spinal Cord Injury Canada

The Corporation is authorized to establish Corporate Members, Supporting Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Life Members, Patron Members, Contributing Members, and such other classifications of membership as the Board may from time to time determine, as follows:

1. The Corporate Members shall be entitled to receive notice of and to attend all meetings of the members of the Corporation and each Corporate Member shall have one (1) vote at each such meeting.
2. Except as otherwise provided by the *Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act*, the Supporting Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Life Members, Patron Members, Contributing Members, and such other classifications of membership as the Board may from time to time determine shall not be entitled to receive notice of, attend or vote at meetings of the members of the Corporation.
