Project Description Summary:
• Hire 12 part-time (hourly contract ambassadors whom have lived experience facing community barriers), a minimum of 3 will be of Indigenous heritage.

- Train ambassadors related to project expectations
- Ambassadors will meet with and negotiate a shadowing experience whereby local municipal and provincial government officials and administrators will spend part of a day observing the ambassador as they negotiate their community, with a focus on what works well and where barriers continue to exist.
- Ambassadors will be a collaborator regarding the development of solutions and policy changes and will support local politicians and administrators to champion changes to the broader civic council and or provincial government.







Project Outcomes:

One policy change that advances inclusion at the municipal level in each region identified above A minimum of one community barrier eliminated in each region identified above.

Project Lead and Partners:

SCI Alberta would lead a collaborative effort supported by the Alberta Disabilities Forum which is a coalition of provincial disability organizations (more than 30 groups in the province)
